The Prophet taught that rizq is decreed before birth, when the angel writes our lifespan, deeds, final state, and sustenance (Bukhari & Muslim, Sunnah.com).

Yet Allah also opens doors when we strive. Effort + tawakkul (trust) bring increase and barakah.

Barakah: The True Multiplier



Rizq is not only quantity but also barakah. A small halal income with barakah stretches farther than larger wealth without it.

- Choose Halal, Avoid Haram (Taqwa) Qur'an 65:2-3.
- Make Dua "O Allah, grant beneficial knowledge, good provision, and accepted deeds." (Ibn Majah).
- Seek Forgiveness (Istighfar) Qur'an 71:10-12.
- Rely on Allah (Tawakkul) Birds leave hungry, return full (<u>Tirmidhi</u>).
- Stay Consistent in Worship Qur'an 20:132.
- Show Gratitude (Shukr) Qur'an 14:7.
- Perform Hajj & Umrah They remove poverty and sins (Tirmidhi).
- Maintain Kinship Ties Expands provision & lifespan (<u>Bukhari</u>).
- Give Charity (Sadaqah) Qur'an 2:261; "Charity does not decrease wealth." (Muslim).
- Migrate for Allah (Hijrah) Qur'an 4:100.
- Support Students of Knowledge Provision may come because of them (Tirmidhi).
- Marry Qur'an 24:32.
- Support the Vulnerable Rizq flows due to caring for the weak (Abu Dawud).
- Be Honest in Business Truthfulness brings blessing (an-Nasa'i).
